Applications require the following materials

- one-page cover letter briefly stating the purpose of the proposed program, the amount requested, and pertinent contact information.
- a one- to four-page narrative proposal that includes the following:
 - background on your group, past accomplishments, a need statement, the project's goals, steps to achieve the goals, how the project will be evaluated and staffed; a one page project budget; a one-page agency budget; a copy of agency 501c(3) letter (if applicable)
